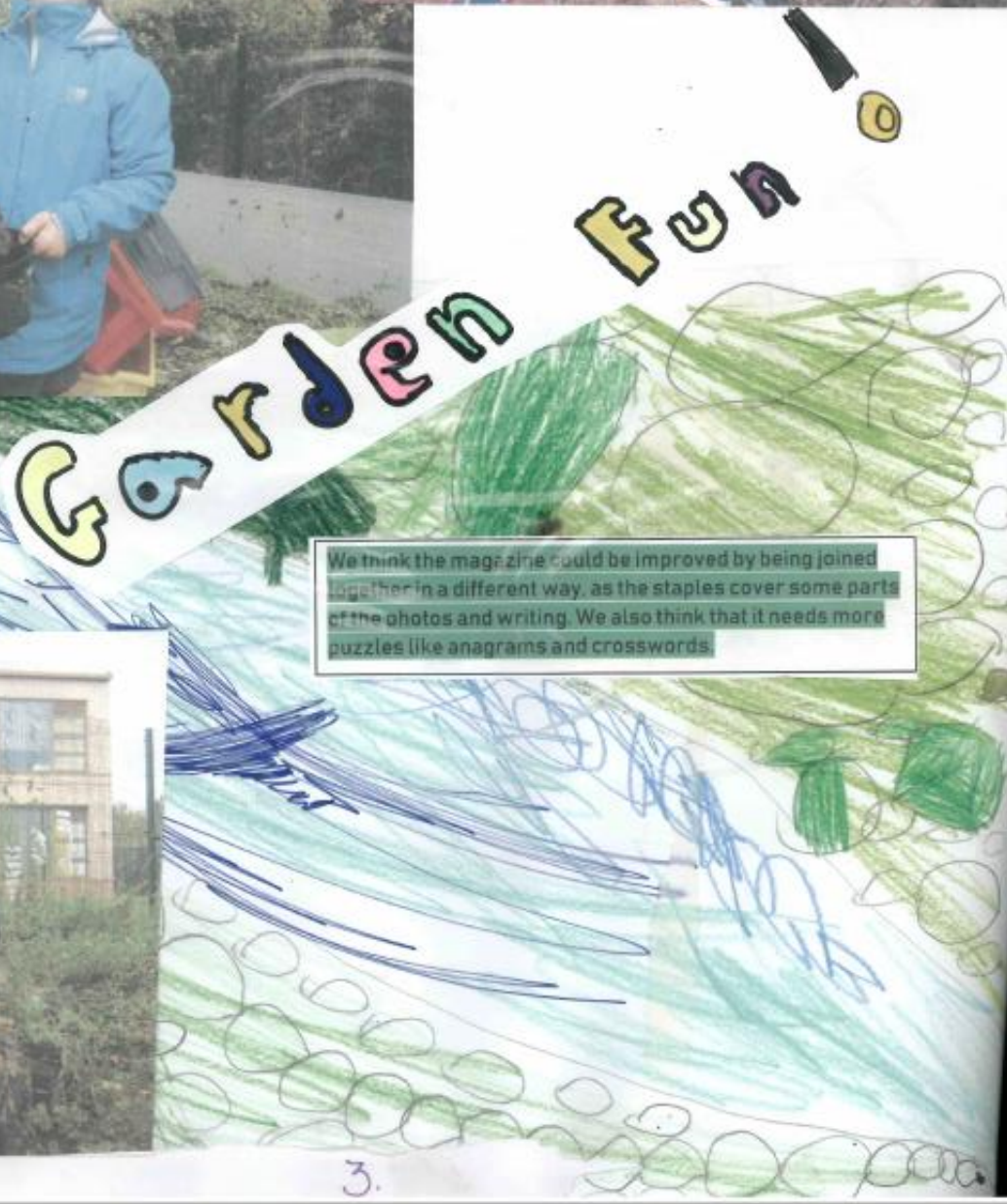

Did you know?
Blackbirds build cup-shaped nests on the trees or in the shrubs. Males collect twigs, bark, mud and leaves, while females use them to construct the nest. The entire process lasts 11 to 14 days. Female lays 3 to 5 bluish-green eggs covered with red blotches.

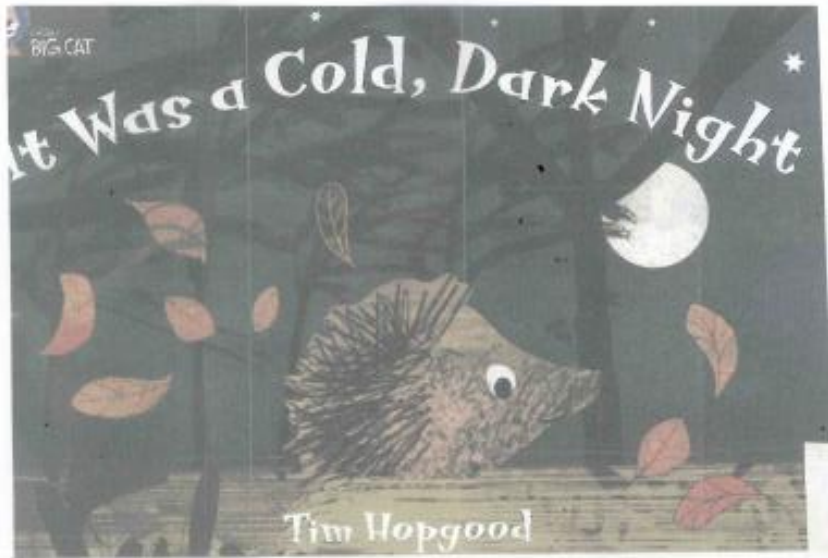

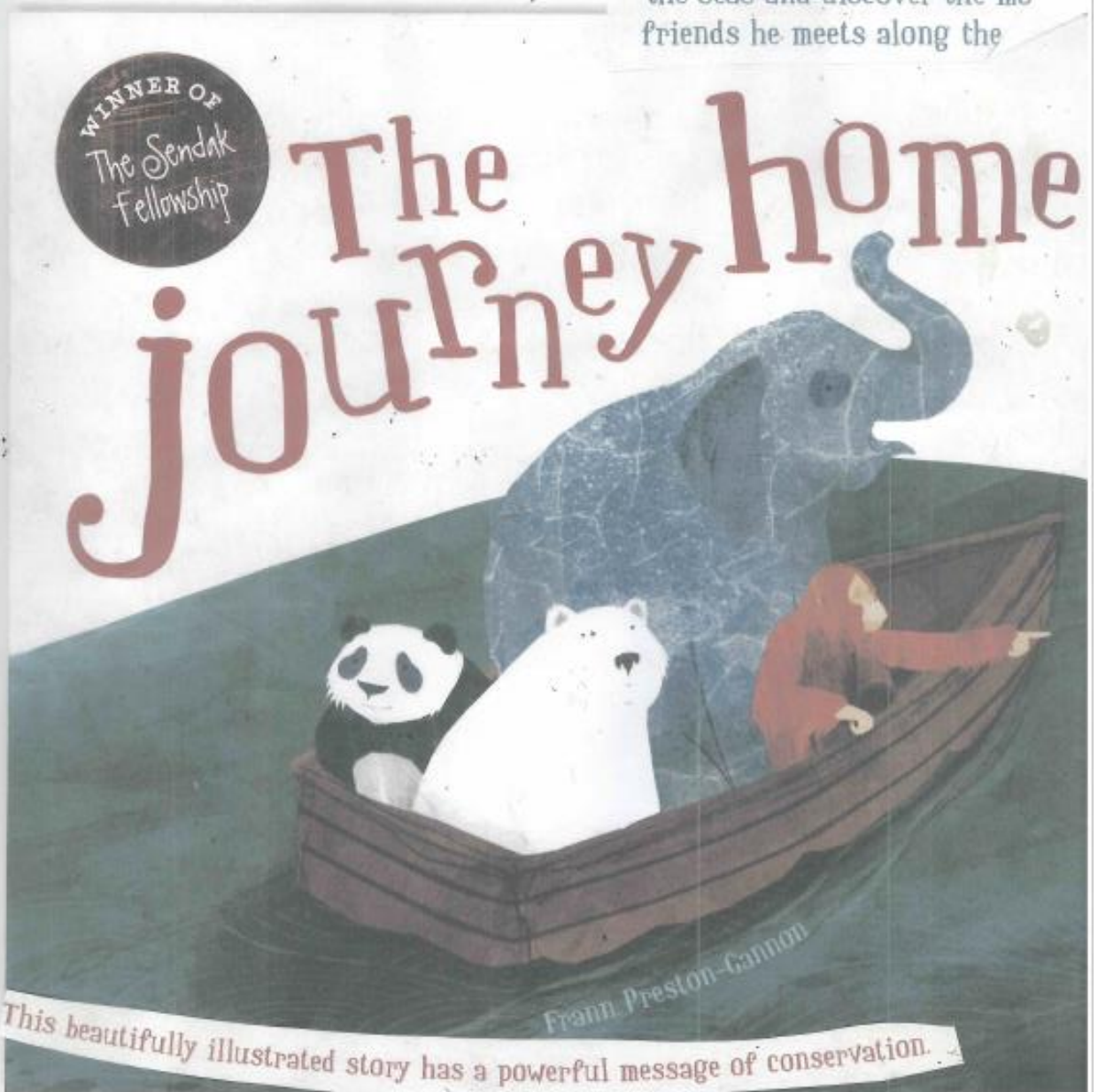

For one day brought such terrible weather...

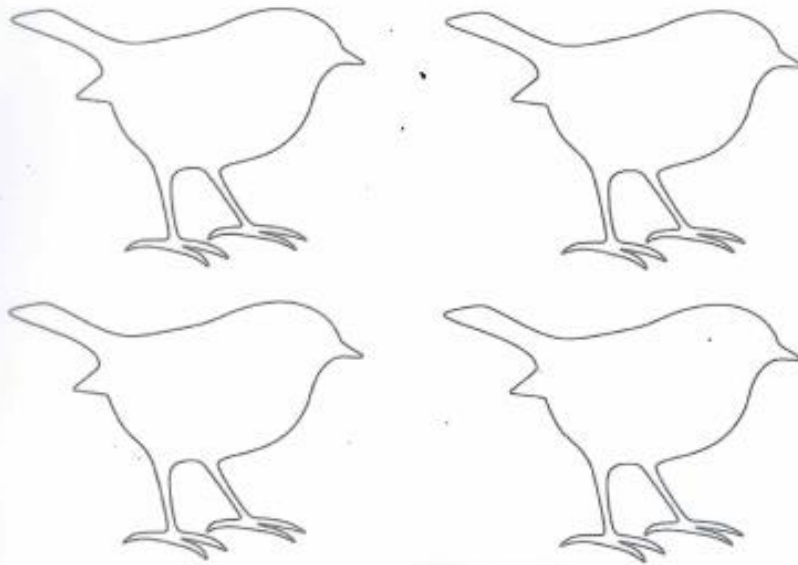
And what bad weather brings; everyone knows,
