

#### An update on joining The Pioneer Trust

We have now had our first half-term working within the Pioneer Academy, I wanted to take this opportunity to update you all on how things are going.



#### **Teaching and Learning**

The biggest impact that we have seen since joining the trust, is their investment in training to support Teaching and Learning in the school. Working in a trust that has 'Outstanding' schools, has ensured that we are able to plot our way to becoming an outstanding school ourselves. On our INSET day in October, we attended a Teaching conference with the other 16 schools in the trust. We had high quality speakers and presentations that were all well received by the teaching staff.

You will have seen the additional INSET days that we have in place for January. These training days are designed to ensure that our school offer of learning is the very best it can be. As we align with the trust and their

vision of a Safe-Happy-Learning school, we are having to commit many hours of quality training. I want to thank you for your understanding around this. As a parent, I know these additional days will be hard for many families to find the child care for- but it is crucial that we are giving staff time for training and preparation to ensure the school can deliver the highest quality of lessons.

The Pioneer Academy uses its own 'Teaching Model' to ensure that every child does their best in all lessons. Having adopted the model this term, we are already starting to see lessons get even better than they were last term! This is no mean feat, when we consider that the school was already very strong before joining the academy.

#### The Pioneer Passport

Year 5 and Falcons are the first classes to have a fully funded school trip. They went to the Observatory Science Centre at Herstmonceux in East Sussex. We are finalising the details with each class to ensure that all children will benefit this year from funded activities from the trust.





#### Pioneer Tournaments

As well as our children competing in our usual local tournaments with Brighton and Hove schools, we have started to compete in trust tournaments as well. This month, we sent a Boys and Girls football team to Hastings to compete in the trust regional matches. The Girls team won and are through to the finals next term! Thanks to the use of the trust minibuses, we were able to compete at no cost to the school or parents.

#### EYFS and Jays outdoor areas

We are thrilled with the significant investment of £100k into our outdoor learning areas for Nursery, Reception and Jays class. We are now able to offer the very best provision for our youngest children in the school and the ASC facility. The trust has plans for additional funding for some other areas of the school within this academic year-more news to follow!



## **Jays Class**

Jays have been doing some fantastic learning about the human body this term. They had some great questions during the knowledge harvest, such as: Why are bogies green? Will a seed grow inside of you if you eat it? Why do we poo? Why do we have different colour eyes and hair? We've loved learning about our bones and the jobs our different organs do. We have been doing lots of different experiments to understand how and why our bodies are so amazing!

This term, we have also been studying traditional fairy tales.

We have looked at a range of fairy tales such as: Jack and the Bean Stalk, the Three Billy Goats Gruff, Little Red Riding hood and much more. We have been understanding the features of fairy tales, classic characters, similarities and differences between fairy tales and beginning to write our own twisted fairy tales. We have really loved this topic so far!



In Maths, Jays have been using different methods to add and subtract. We have loved using the resources to help us understand how we can complete these challenges in a variety of different ways. It has been tricky, but we are getting there. Some of us are subtracting from three-digit numbers. Others are using a combination of part-

whole and number lines to calculate.

Jays and Falcons class will hosting a craft and bake sale on the 14<sup>th</sup> of December. We welcome all parents and guardians to join us on that day for celebrations and Christmas themed activities!









#### **Puffins Class**

We have completed our unit of learning about how humans work. We learnt about nutrients, healthy food and vitamins and designed our own healthy meal. We also learnt about the four components that make up the blood in our bodies – plasma, white blood cells, red blood cells and platelets. We then built some 'blood' with a variety of art supplies. We used yellow food colouring, water and glue as the plasma, red food colouring as the red blood cells, blue glitter as the white blood cells and red glitter as the platelets. We watched as the blood 'flowed' slowly through the vein (bottle).



During relating week, we have been thinking about how to make a noise about bullying. We have created our own helping hands, thought about ways we can be kind and discussed what bullying behaviour may look like.



### Swallows Class discover a range of flavours with Chef John

Swallows class were paid a visit by a professional chef! Chef John transformed the classroom into a restaurant, and the children all became chefs. This is the first of three workshops we will have with Chef John.

The focus for this session was on using all our senses to carefully taste a variety of different foods - including some highly unusual jellies.

We also learnt about the importance of eating a balanced diet, and the different nutrients that various types of food provide.

We are looking forward to having John back next year, to learn about knife skills and bread making!







## **Falcons Class**

The last few weeks have been filled with fun and excitement in Falcons class.

In Week 2 of Autumn 2, Falcons visited Pizza Express. We journeyed on the bus from school to the restaurant in Hove and were met by friendly staff members who showed us how to make a pizza.





Falcons took part in another trip a week later as we joined Swallows class with a visit to the Observatory Science Centre in Herstmonceux. We spent large parts of the day exploring the centre where there were countless exhibits to discover, including a vacuum-powered chair and anti-gravity wheel.

We were also given a special science show where we learnt about Tim Peake, the International Space Station and infra-red technology. In the afternoon the groups also took part in a robotic arms activity which tested their resilience and teamwork skills









Towards the end of Autumn 2, the ASC facility will be hosting a bake and craft sale on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> December.

## Swallows & Falcons visit the Observatory Science Centre in Herstmonceux

Swallows and Falcons classes embarked on their trip to the Observatory Science centre, to support their learning on the *Space Scientists* topic for the Autumn Term. We had a wonderful time, despite the rain!

At the museum, we had the chance to engage and experiment with dozens of interactive exhibits. Some of our favourites included a vacuum-powered chair, an earthquake simulator, and a trick mirror that could make your face change into someone else's!

We also got to see the *Destination Space* science show, all about the science involved in sending humans and spacecraft into space. We learnt how rockets are fuelled, what astronauts eat, and what happens to a marshmallow man in a vacuum.

After lunch, it was time for the robotic arms workshop. We all had a turn practising controlling robotic arms to manoeuvre various objects.

Finally, we had a chance to see two of the huge telescopes kept at the observatory centre, including one that was more than 100 years old!

On Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> November our Y5/6 Girls and Boys football teams took part in a tournament at Hollington Primary School in Hastings.


They played an amazing five matches against other schools within our academy including Holland Juniors, Edenbridge, Hollington and Moulsecoomb.

You will need to be of a minimum of 25 years of age and hold a current clean driving licence, which has a D1 mini bus license and will need to disclose if you have had any claims on your own insurance within the last 5 years.
