



Goldcrests Class

Goldcrests have really enjoyed being in year 1! We have explored our Brainwaves theme over the past few weeks as part of our IPC unit. We met professor sparks and learnt various ways to keep our brains healthy. In English we have explored 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' where we went on a fun noun hunt! We loved retelling this incredible story. In maths, we have been exploring 'more than' and 'less than'. We met a very hungry alligator who only likes to eat numbers that are greater! We look forward to learning our IPC unit 'Treasure Islands'.









Skylarks Class

Skylarks have settled in well to their new class and have been very busy doing lots of learning already! In Maths, we have been making 2-digit numbers up to 100 and counting in twos, fives, tens and threes. In English, we have been learning a story called 'Kassim and the Hungry Fox' and are now learning an explanation text all about The Great Fire of London.

We are especially excited about our new topic From A to B. So far, we have been focusing on the geography tasks and have found out about different types of transport, how we all get to school, what is in our local area and have also mapped out our routes to school.













Jays Class

Jays have had an exciting beginning to term by focusing on our getting ready routines, writing poetry and completing place value challenges in maths.

In our poetry sessions, we have discovered our love for Michael Rosen, as well as writing poetry based on the book Fantastic Forests. We used this as inspiration to write our own animal poetry - focusing on writing rhyming couplets and then performing them to the class.

In addition to this, we also visited Pizza Express. It was very exciting catching the bus and all the pupils in Jays loved tasting their creations. We'd also like to give a massive thank you to all the parents who attended to support us on the trip!













Puffins Class

Year 3 have made a fantastic start to the year. We have enjoyed getting interested in our new unit – How Humans Work. First, we did a work out to see how our body reacted. We then drew around some members of our class and labelled the parts of the body. We have learnt about the eyes, ears, teeth, digestive system and skeleton. We spent a lesson making lungs from straws balloons and bottles and a lesson recreating the digestive system!









Starlings Class

Super Starlings have settled back into school beautifully. We have had a great time investigating sound and light in lots of practical ways.









We have also been looking at how the brain works and how we learn best. We had a go at code breaking and even made marshmallow and spaghetti towers—sticky but fun!









Swallows Class

Swallows class have made a fantastic start to year 5. The children have settled in well and are making a great start to their learning.

In English, we've been using drama to explore characters' emotions in our class text *Street Child.* The children have used this to craft some wonderful fictional diary entries.

In our *Brainwaves* Unit, the students taught each other various talents and we explored different memorisation and mindfulness strategies.

We've also kicked off our *Space Scientists* unit, by researching the planets of our solar system and creating pop-up books, including our favourite planetary facts











Ravens Class

Ravens have settled into school life well and have been engaged in a variety of practical activities to explore some of the new topics we are looking at this year. This has included creating some fantastic dioramas to explore some of the habitats of endangered animals for the entry point of our new topic 'Existing, Endangered and Extinct'. We had fun using art and natural materials to create the habitats of various endangered animals from the Asian elephant to the red panda.













Falcons Class

It has been a lovely start to the year in Falcons. The students have welcomed Emilio into our class which demonstrates their kindness and respect.

We have completed a unit of work called 'Brainwave'. Throughout this unit, students reflected on their learning, thinking about how they learn best and what they can do to improve how they learn. We played several different games which the class enjoyed, including a blindfold trust game that encouraged clear communication between students.







Falcons class have been taking part in structured physical exercises every morning as part of our getting ready time. During these sessions, students practice different exercises to become more aware of what is happening in their body.







We have also spent time learning about our class pioneer for this year – Alan Turing. We have learnt how to use secret codes to send messages (but we made sure to learn how to decrypt them too!)

As a school community, we need to remain committed in ensuring our children are able to come to school on time and every day.

Attendance Top Tips:

- Please use Studybugs to report absence and provide as much detail as possible when reporting.
- If you are struggling with drop off/pickups we have our Breakfast Club and After School club which you can book into – please contact front office for more information
- Why not try the Parent/Carer What's App group if you are needing to get some occasional help with pick up and drop offs
- Nurture Breakfast (run by our lovely Mrs Martin) is available for all children
 who may be feeling a little bit worried/sad/anxious about the beginning of the
 school day. This starts at 8.40, based in the Hive and is FREE
- Our Welfare Manager, Natalie Bellis is ALWAYS available to discuss ways of supporting with attendance/lateness
- Do talk with us at school to let us know if there are difficulties if we know we can help!
- Our Schools Mental Health Service can offer support and advice around possible barriers to attendance especially in relation to Emotionally Based School Avoidance (Coffee Morning taking place in November)
- Please do talk about the importance of coming to school every day with your child.
- If your child is having a lot of time absent due to illness, we can help by linking you in with our amazing School Nurse, Katie Farmer
- Any evidence to support your child's absence will be gratefully received. This
 will help us to code the absence correctly and ensure you and your child are
 getting the right level of help

Do Remember:

- Holidays in term time will always be unauthorised
- Absence for more than 3 days due to illness will require supporting evidence from the GP/Nurse/pharmacy
- Report any absence via the Studybugs app
- Attendance is EVERYONES responsibility



Here at West Blatchington Primary & Nursery School our excellent Breakfast Club ensures that the children have the opportunity to start their school day in a calm, relaxed atmosphere.

Mrs King and Mrs Jackson supervise this popular club; it runs from 7.45am to 8.30am every day. It allows children to sit with their friends as

Introducing our Education Mental Heath Practitioner

Hello, my name is Zoey Bell and I am an Education mental health practitioner (EMHP) working for the schools mental health service. I work directly with pupils in Keystage 2 and work alongside Natalie Bellis to support wellbeing and positive mental health in West Blatchington.

I am based at West Blatchington Primary School one day per week.

As an EMHP I help Children and young people get early intervention for mental health difficulties in an environment that is well known to them.

I offer low-intensity interventions for children and young people with mild to moderate mental health difficulties, such as depression, anxiety, worry, phobias, or sleep difficulties.

As an EMHP I work as part of a mental health support team with other mental health professionals. I work collaboratively with my team and sometimes may need to refer the children and young people I see on to other agencies.

My role is part of the government initiative to provide more mental health support in schools and colleges.

A coffee morning is being arranged for the next ½ term so I can introduce myself and my role more fully to the wonderful school community



Keeping our school community safe and happy

If someone else is picking up your child at the end of the day, please let front office know and the message will be passed on to the teacher.

If you have a parking permit – please park safely in our car park, smaller children can sometimes not be visible when cars are not parked in allocated bays.

If you need to park outside the school, please can you park in a safe place, avoiding the yellow zig-zag lines; double yellow lines and near junctions.

We have a fleet of minibuses located at three of our schools: Red Hill Primary School in Chislehurst, Kent, Broadmead Primary School in Croydon & Moulescoomb Primary School in Brighton. You will need to be of a minimum of 25 years of age and hold a current clean driving licence, which has a D1 mini bus license and will need to disclose if you have had any claims on your own insurance within the last 5 years.

This role will include collecting and dropping off pupils and staff from any of our schools across South East London, Kent, Surrey, Sussex and Brighton & Hove, depending on the location of the drivers and their availability.

- To be responsible for carrying out driving duties.
